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HOPE GPA:

HOPE GPA is the average of ALL core classes – calculated by the Georgia Student Finance Commission (GSFC) using your English, Math, Science, Social Studies, and World Languages ONLY! It includes courses you passed and/or failed! There are no extra quality points for Honors but 0.5 extra quality points are given for AP and DE courses, up to 4.0. The HOPE scholarships can be used at in-state colleges/universities. For private colleges/universities, only a portion of the tuition is covered which is at a much lower rate than the GA public colleges/universities.

What type of training do you need to achieve your career goals?

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| On-The-Job Training | Structured hands-on training by a peer or supervisor over a short period of time. These types of careers don't typically require tests for certification or licensure. |
| Apprenticeship | Typically takes 1-6 years to learn the job from someone who is licensed in the field. Often requires formal licensure and may also require formal classes to learn the skills and prepare for the exam. Receive pay and benefits while training. |
| Military | Full-Time (Active Duty) or Part-Time (Reserves) Air Force, Army, Army National Guard, Coast Guard, Marines, Navy |
| Specialty School | Offer training in a specific career area. Note: They can be expensive. Financial Aid may be limited. |
| Technical College | State technical colleges that allow you to earn certificates, diplomas, or associate degrees in multiple career fields. |
| Four-Year College | Earn a bachelor's degree in multiple career fields. |

Unsure what do you want to do after high school?

- Step 1: Take an Interest Inventory (available on Naviance or sign up to take the ASVAB)
- Step 2: Once you have your results, make a list of careers you want to research.
- Step 3: Determine the occupational outlook for the career(s).
- Step 4: Look for schools/programs that offer the major or training for that career.
- Step 5: Meet with your School Counselor to talk about next steps.

Sign-up to take the ASVAB (Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery) at Pebblebrook HS on October 12th! It can be used for the military or for insight into your career strengths. (Scores are not automatically released to the military).

HOW TO REQUEST YOUR TRANSCRIPT (2 STEP PROCESS)

NOTE: Transcripts will only be sent to schools you are **ACTIVELY APPLYING** to and not schools you are “Thinking about”. It is the student’s responsibility to complete the steps below or the Transcript will **NOT** be sent.

STEP 1: Login to NAVIANCE STUDENT

1. On the main page, under **Favorites**, choose “**Colleges I’m Applying To**”.
2. Click on the **pink circle with the plus sign** (far right-hand side).
3. **Choose your college, the app type (deadline you are planning to apply by) and how you will apply (Common App, Direct to Institution, etc.)**. The app type is very important. If you don’t choose correctly, we can’t release your transcript.
 - a. For Common App documents, you **MUST** “Match” your Common App (directions on back)
4. Then choose **Add Application**. You will do this for each school you want to send a transcript to.

If you are applying to colleges using the Common Application, you MUST match your Common Application account in Naviance (see pink ribbon on your “Applying to” page)

Do Not Request Letters of Rec Through the Common App!

1. Login to NAVIANCE (**It won’t work if you GOOGLE Naviance!**)
2. On the main page, under **Favorites**, choose **Colleges I’m Applying To**.
3. Click on the **Match** button at the top of the page.
4. Enter the same email address you used for your Common Application.

WAIVING FERPA rights (FEDERAL EDUCATIONAL RIGHTS AND PRIVACY ACT)

- **What is FERPA?** FERPA regulates the privacy of student education records, which could include your application to the college where you enroll. FERPA also gives you the right to review confidential letters of recommendation provided as part of that application after you enroll.
- **Should you waive your rights on your college application?**
 - Waiving your right lets colleges know that you do not intend to read your recommendations, which helps reassure colleges that the letters are candid and truthful.
 - Some recommenders may decline to write a letter for you if you do not waive your rights. Check with your counselor or teachers to see if any of them follow such a policy.

REQUESTING A LETTER OF RECOMMENDATION (LOR)

ALWAYS give a recommender at least a two-week advance notice for a LOR!

HOW TO REQUEST A COUNSELOR RECOMMENDATION or School Report in Common App

1. **REQUIRED:** Complete the “**Counselor Letter of Rec**” survey in Naviance.
 - a. In Naviance on your landing page, scroll down to find: **Tasks from my School** and click on **Counselor Letter of Rec Survey**.
 - b. Complete each section thoroughly and thoughtfully. This will allow your counselor to write a personalized letter of recommendation.
2. Email your counselor when you have completed this so they know that they can begin writing your letter. Include the school(s) you are applying to and the deadline(s).

HOW TO REQUEST A TEACHER RECOMMENDATION

Remember you should always ask if the teacher will write you a letter before you send a request!

1. Login to Naviance.
2. On the **Home page**, go to **Colleges**, then **Apply to College** and choose **Letters of Recommendation**.
3. Choose **Add Request**
4. Then, click on the drop down and **select the teacher** you would like to write your letter.
5. Next, **choose the school** that needs the letter.
6. **Include a personal note** to the teacher.
7. After you have submitted your request in Naviance, **follow up with the teacher a day or two later** to make sure they received the electronic request. It may have gone to their junk mail.

Scholarship Information

1. **All scholarships are housed in Naviance.** When we receive information about scholarships, we post them in Naviance so the list is constantly updated. There is also information about specific scholarships that colleges/universities offer. It is the student’s responsibility to check Naviance to see any updated scholarships.
2. Students are required to complete all the necessary components that the scholarship requires. This includes requesting transcripts and emailing recommenders for a LOR. Again, please give recommenders sufficient time to complete a LOR.
3. Scholarship deadlines, like college application deadlines, are firm. You snooze, you lose out on money.
4. Sign up for scholarship notifications from different scholarship search engines like www.goingmerry.com
